申命記における28章69節の位置付け

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ABSTRACT Kenichi OKUDA, "The Function of Dt 28:69 in Deuteronomy." It has been discussed that Dt 28:69 (MT) functions as a superscript or a subscript. In this paper, we decided the function of this verse in Deuteronomy. First, we compared Dt 28:69 with the verses in Pentateuch which have "מְלֶבֶּרְ (or מְלֵבֶּרְ " style and in the Old Testament which have "מֵלֶבְּרְ (or מֵלֶבְּרְ " style. As the result, we found that Dt 28:69 functions as a subscript. From this it follows that "the covenant at Horeb" means the Ten Commandments which was written on two stones, and that "the words of the covenant in Moab" means the Moses' Address at Dt 5-28, where inclusio was used, based on the covenant at Horeb. Finally, we show that Dt 28:69 functions not only as a subscript but as transitional to the Dt 29. Here this transition can be explained by Parunak's transitional technique and the pattern is Ab/B according to Parunak.
